President's Report

Season 2022/2023 saw a return to a relatively normal cricket season, after the past few seasons were severely impacted by COVID. The Burwood District Cricket Club fielded 7 sides across all competitions, with 3 Saturday Senior sides, a Tuesday T20 side, Sunday Veterans, a Saturday Super 7 and a Sunday Fast 9 junior side. Our First XI made the C Grade grand final, but fell agonizingly short by a solitary wicket. Both our Second XI (F Grade) and T20 (SEDA College Shield) sides made their respective Semi Finals. By the end of the season we had 115 players register with the club (89 Senior and 26 Junior players). So whilst there was no premiership it was another successful season for our club on the field.

Unfortunately at the Annual General Meeting back in June, the club found itself in the position where there were no nominations for a number of committee roles which included a club President. This had a severe impact on how the club functioned and the programs it was able to deliver this season. Disappointingly our Woolworths Blast program did not run due to the lack of club volunteers. It is also the basics of entering scores online, cleaning the change rooms, storing equipment or painting crease lines that need volunteers around the club. These are all simple tasks that can be done by the poorest of time-poor people. We all need to play an active role in the club for it to function. All sporting clubs need dedicated volunteers just to do the day-to-day tasks of a successful club. This year, especially in the off-season there was too much to do for just a small few.

Whilst it can involve giving up significant time to be on the committee, it can also be a very rewarding experience to help run a club for the members. Like anything in life, the more people that are involved, the less of a burden it can be. Many hands make light work! Season 2022/2023 was certainly a "pivot year" for the club and we hope that next season we see more new people step up and we see growth and positive change once again.

To those who were on the committee, Darren Veitch, Adrian Reus, Abhishek Pratap, Vivek Onamalai, Arjit Banerjee, Arvind Suryanarayana, Jay Kaler, Tom Golding and Narayan Ramakrishnan, thank you for your efforts this year and the positive impact that you had around the club throughout the season. Thanks also to our captains, Arjit, Venkat and Udai, Shoubhik and Vivek, Hari and Darren for the time and effort you gave to ensure our Senior teams got out there on the pitch each week. Without people like the gentlemen above, the club doesn't function. So again thank you, and we hope more of our members will consider volunteering and helping around the club in the future.

A special thanks to lan Scholefield, for his continuous work, preparing articles for the website, researching about our club and the local area, for the communications he sends and social gatherings he organises for our past members. It is so appreciated by everyone how lan keeps people "in the loop" of what is happening around the club and the sharing of stories from the past.

We also acknowledge the recent passing of club life member Colin McDonald, after whom our Club Champion Award is named after. Colin was a passionate Burra and we thank Ian who spoke at the funeral about Colin's journey at the Burra. "Macca" has certainly left a legacy at the Burra. Colin will be missed and our thoughts are with the family. The club obituary for Colin, which was prepared by Ian, can be found on our <u>club website</u>.

To our club sponsors, we thank you for your continued support of the club. To Steve at Roaring Success, Shoubhik at Treadcare and Bert at Chemist Warehouse your generous support has allowed us to provide for our members in terms of equipment, apparel and uniforms. This included new hats free of charge to all players across the club.

This year we also welcomed Masuri to the Burra, as our apparel partners for the next three years. We thank Jarryd Di Genova from Masuri for his assistance throughout the season to provide us with our new range of apparel and our club-branded helmets. Masuri provided us with a new green-coloured playing top which was adapted across the whole club as well as a range of new off-field and traditional "whites" apparel. The club still has a large inventory in stock that is available for purchase through the club store.

With minimal COVID restrictions, we were able to hold club functions and events once again. This year we again ran the Chemist Warehouse Fitness Challenge, Roaring Success Golf Day and other social events such as the world cup sweep pizza night, junior team dinners, a poker night and of course the BBQs across the finals. A thank you to all the people who were responsible for planning and delivering those events for our members and to those who assisted on the day. Unfortunately, our planned Treadcare Cup pre-season match with Laburnum Cricket Club was called off due to the wet weather.

In November I was involved in discussions with the council about the Hartwell Pavilion redevelopment. Disappointingly, due to the rise of costs within the building industry, Boroondara Council have decided to put a hold on the Hartwell Redevelopment for at least the next 18 to 24 months. Such is the rise of costs associated with the building industry, the allocated budget for capital works across a number of the council projects is insufficient to complete the works. This means that our pavilion redevelopment has been put on hold for the time being. This is certainly a major disappointment to everyone involved at the club. There are plans and drawings of what the pavilion may look like, but due to the delay, these plans are currently being withheld from sharing with us, which again is disappointing.

There were a large number of individual club milestones achieved this season; congratulations to Jake Evans (3000 runs), Ash Warren and Doug Paroissien (200 games), Bede Allsopp (300 games) and of course one of the highlights for the season was Adrian "Dogman" Reus' 500th game celebration at Hartwell. Which was followed up a couple of weeks later with his 1000th club wicket.

There were also players who were recognised by the BHRDCA for their efforts throughout the year. Congratulations to Shiv Goundan (C Grade - Batting), Sukhraj Bhullar (F Grade - Batting) and Jay Kaler (I Grade - Bowling) for receiving BHRDCA Association awards for the season. A well done also to Gemma Blundell who was selected as captain of the BHRDCA Under 12 Claudia Fatone team for the VMCU carnival in January. A big congratulations to all above for their achievements.

Back in September, I myself received an award on behalf of the club at the Boroondara Council Sports Awards, as a finalist for the Club Person of the Year. I thank Abhishek and the club for the nomination. It was nice for our club to receive recognition from the council for all the hard work and time spent that has seen such a positive change at the club over the last few years.

This was said last year, but this report will most definitely be my last. 20 years of playing, coaching and volunteering at the club has gone by so quickly. I thank the club and all its members for the unforgettable memories and lifelong friendships that have been forged at Hartwell, but it is now time to call my innings at the Burra to a close. I wish the club, and everyone involved in it all the very best. Thanks again to everyone for their support and encouragement, and a special thanks to my family for allowing me to play the part that I have.

Junior Cricket Report

Season 2022/2023 saw the club field two junior teams, one in each of the BHRDCA Super 7 (Sat) and Fast 9's (Sun) competitions. This season saw 24 junior players register with the club, in addition to that there were 2 Woolworths Blast registrations. This number included 5 new players that we welcomed to the club from either our own Blast program or from another club.

Whilst neither of our junior competitions played for premiership points, both teams had successful seasons, with all players showing enormous improvement throughout the year. Particularly our Super 7 team, with their experience of playing last season and with their natural growth, the team won most of the games that they played. Whilst our Fast 9 team, who didn't win a lot of games, they were still competitive and showed great determination each match they played. Training was held at Hartwell each Thursday and we enjoyed a couple of entertaining intra club games throughout the year.

We thank the club for their support and the new resources (iPads for scoring, first aid and equipment kits) that were provided for each of our junior teams. The "juniors" also enjoyed wearing their new coloured tops this season, as opposed to traditional whites. A thank you to all the parents for their support and assistance with umpiring, scoring and ground set up for home and away games. But an even bigger thank you for the continual commitment they show to the club by having their children play at the Burra. A special thank you to Kaveen and Andrew who acted as team managers for the respective teams and Sanjay and lain who did more than their fair share of umpiring throughout the year. Thanks also to Bede Allsopp, who gave up his time to assist with training and pass on his vast experience and enthusiasm for cricket to the kids.

For next season our two teams and their players will look to move up to a higher level. Our Super 7 team from this year will look to play in a Fast 9 competition. Whereas our Fast 9 group of players will look to move into an Under 13 competition within the Inner South East Cricket competition. The benefit of making this move is that the team will be able to continue playing the Fast 9 (Stage 2) cricket format, with 9 players a side and some modified rules. It is interesting to note that this same group of players in the Fast 9's all started together in Woolworths Blast four seasons ago.

TREASURER'S REPORT

After a few interrupted years, it's fair to say the normality of a regular cricket season was back. While we had the opportunity in previous years to invest in the club and make the most of the generous grants we received, this season was about giving back to our players and getting our boys enjoying being out there again.

With the optimism of a successful season ahead, the committee joined up with Masuri to invest and launch a new merchandise range across both our senior and junior teams. This predominantly included a new set of colour and white clothing, plus off field merchandise for our members and supporters. This was well received by our players, especially with a focus of wearing the new 'one day' tops across our one day, VETS and T20 teams. With the club growing players and members over the years, we look forward to working with Masuri again in 2023/2024 to continue supplying our players with top quality merchandise.

Like last season, we continued to roll our senior and junior memberships which saw a resounding number of players committing for the season. In total, we had over 100 players across our Senior and Junior formats purchase either a Full or Mini membership this season, an increase from our previous season. As we look towards future years, the committee will continue to work with the players to gauge an appropriate playing fee, to ensure we continue to get more and more members committing to a full-season membership.

Like the past few seasons, we continue to be generously supported by our major sponsors - Roaring Success, Treadcare and Chemist Warehouse. This generous sponsorship money allowed us to continue investing in our Junior and Senior players, contributing towards merchandise costs, and also equipment around the club. We again thank them all for their generosity over the last couple of years and look forward to working closely with them going forward.

Like many events outside of cricket, social events around the club were back where we all wanted it to be. It was pleasing to have our Burra family and friends back in the club rooms post-training and match day, enjoying a nice meal and drink whenever we got the chance to do so. Thanks to our partners at Souv and Co, we had a few Burger nights post-training, which was a great bonding session for both the junior and senior players.

Thanks to the success of our 1st and 2nds on the field, we were also able to host both a Semi-Final and Grand Final weekend at Hartwell, which saw many players, family and friends from BDCC and opposing clubs enjoy a few thrilling games. This allowed us to sell Food and drinks across the weekend, raising a profit of nearly \$1k across the 2 weekends.

We also were able to host another year of the Roaring Success Golf Day, Treadcare Cup and finish off with a presentation night at the Notting Hill Hotel for the seniors, and a Ten Pin Bowling afternoon for our Juniors.

Overall, the season 2022/2023 was another successful year for the club, as we continue to grow and scale our teams across the seniors and juniors. With over 100 active members and many past players slowly coming back to Hartwell and other social events, the club is aiming to keep building, in particular as we hit the 100-year mark in 2028.

Financially, the club finished this year at a **loss of \$1,164**, however with a healthy bank position, in-stock merchandise, and other equipment sitting on our balance sheet, we are in a strong position entering another season. By referring to our balance sheet, **our net assets position has gone up this year by \$1,691**, due to our added investment in Merchandise and equipment

To conclude, I'd like to thank the committee, players and extended members of Burwood District CC, for your ongoing support and cooperation throughout the season. Also, a special mention to Adrian Reus who acted as a coco-treasurer this year and supported the club in many ways on and off the field.

Secretary's Report

As we look back on the troubled and historic years of 2020 and 2021, I think we can take pride in how the whole cricket club rallied together to overcome the various hurdles that were placed before us. The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic spoiled many plans during those two seasons.

However, it is to the club's immense credit that it could call on so many positive people during those difficult times. We owe our 2020/21 and 2021/22 committees, and our club captains a huge amount of thanks for their efforts in keeping the club going and going strong.

It is with a great sense of pride that I can report that our club has completed another successful year both on and off the field, and it is with great pleasure to present this secretary's report for the Burwood District Cricket Club for the 2022/23 financial year.

Before discussing any specifics, I would like to highlight the incredible amount of off & on-field work that goes on to keep a club like this running. It is important not only to recognise the wonderful job done by my fellow committee members but also to appreciate each and every person who helps out with any job, big or small when required. From tasks as small as jumping behind the BBQ to serve all the people attending our matches, especially during finals week, assisting in running a net at training, aiding your captain on gameday, and of course showing up to the club's AGM to make sure that our voices be heard, all these things are extremely important to keep the wheels turning. With that, I wish to thank all the volunteers who selflessly devote their time and efforts to ensure our club functions in the way it does.

On the field

Burwood District's playing numbers have continued to have a steady growth each season over the last few years as the club managed to field 5 senior and 2 junior teams across Saturdays and Sundays. We had 113 Summer 2022/2023 registrations which included 89 senior player registrations and 24 junior player registrations. 2-day cricket returned as our First and Second XI senior teams played in the C grade (70 overs) and F grade (64 over split innings) two-day competition.

We kicked off our season with the 'Treadcare Cup', which this time was an internal practice game as opposed to the annual fixture with Laburnum Cricket Club as grounds were not ready due to heavy rain through August and September made scheduling the game with Laburnum C.C. difficult this year. Three of our senior teams made finals this season – the T20 team making the semi-final lost a close against Blackburn South C.C., and the Second XIs too lost in the semi-final against Manningham C.C. in a nail-biter. The C-grade grand final played by our First XI was the last game for any team this season. The team came close to winning the flag but in the end, lost by a wicket to Blackburn North C.C.

For the 22/23 season, the club fielded teams in the Box Hill Reporter District Cricket Association as follows:

1st XI – C Grade 70 overs 2-day competition

2nd XI - F Grade 64 overs split innings 2-day competition

3rd XI – I Grade 35 overs 1-day competition

Vets XI – B Division 40 over 1-day competition

Another proud moment for the club came at BHRDCA's 22/23 Presentation night held on 21st April 2023, where three of senior cricketers – Shivanay Goundan (First XI), Sukhraj Bhullar (Second XI) and Jitendra Kaler (Third XI) won best in their grade awards as below –

Shivanay Goundan – C grade batting award for scoring 464 runs at an average of 66.29. Sukhraj Bhullar – F grade batting award for scoring 275 runs at an average of 68.75 Jitendra Kaler – I grade bowling award for taking 21 wickets at an average of 9.1

Another on-field moment that is now etched in Burra history is **Adrian 'Dogman' Reus** picking up his 1000th wicket for the club in a game against Croydon Ranges C.C. on 4th December 2022.

While I have reported the above on-field successes, a failure this year has been us not getting many registrations for our Junior Blast programs which have been a huge success in the last few years. We had only 2 registrations come in this year and hence, we decided to not organise it for this season and send the 2 kids to another club's program. The consistent rain and cold weather along with changing community sports outlook

are two of the reasons that we observed after discussing with nearby clubs who reported similar drops this year. However, this will be a focus next year for us as a committee to get the program up and running at the club.

Off the field

On infrastructure development, the club facilities and rooms redevelopment project will be delayed after discussions with the Boroondara Council highlighted the change in budget priorities for the council causing this delay. The Club thanks the outgoing **President (Mr. Mark Blundell)** for representing the club at all council meetings regarding redevelopment and design process discussions.

The club has also applied for a Sporting Victoria grant for Uniforms and Equipment, the outcome for which is awaited at the time of writing this report.

Future direction

A few new things will be taking place this season as we transition from the MyCricket platform to PlayHQ in managing our cricket statistics and record keeping. Arvind Suryanarayana, who looked into our Tech and IT management this season has taken the lead and attended the introduction sessions by Cricket Victoria for this transition. One of the main tasks in this transition would be data management of our existing statistics on MyCricket by exporting all the club data. The 23/24 committee will be working on this and send updates on our website and social media on this project.

Also, with Mark Blundell stepping down from the President's role, this will be another transition that the committee and the club will manage. I thank Mark for all his hard work, effort and guidance during his presidency in which the club has grown leaps and bounds.

Historian's Report

BDCC CENTENARY HISTORY - PROGRESS REPORT - MAY 2023

Focus on the past 12 months has been in the following areas:

HISTORICAL RESEARCH

(1) Newspaper reviews

Whilst I have reviewed various newspapers for the years 1922-1968, both online through Trove (NLA - National Library of Australia) and at the State Library of Victoria, there have been gaps in each year, particularly in the 1942-1945 war year period and the editions immediately around Christmas and the New Year each year. It is my intention to extend the coverage of the Box Hill Reporter from 1931 to 1950 and to examine The Melbourne Star (Argus evening paper) from Nov 1933 – Feb 1936 on microfilm.

(2) Personal Interviews

Personal interviews were held with Stuart McLaine (son of Life Member Don) and Brian Millane a player from 1958/59. Other interviews related to the development of stories produced for the website, particularly for the achievement of milestones.

(3) Historical Societies

During the past twelve months, I have visited the Box Hill, Waverley and Whitehorse (formerly Nunawading) Historical Societies. Each group have an amazing storage of memories, documents and photographs which will benefit our future publications.

A tri-yearly newsletter, and now magazine, Burwood Bulletin commenced in November 1980 and continues up to today. I have reviewed all editions which are held at Box Hill Historical Society and more recent editions online.

(4) Burwood and District Cricket Association (BDCA) 1922-1968

The local competition with which we were affiliated from the beginning (1928) was BDCA. Our club have extremely limited information and data before the sixties so attention has been focussed on this period.

I have put together schedules of clubs and gradings by year, office-bearers, Premierships, Grand Final scores, Association Trophy Winners, ladders, primary grounds and connected organizations of all clubs.

A loan of scorebooks from Burwood CC, East Burwood CC and Burwood YCW CC has provided scores from around 25 games which we previously had no details.

The gathering of the aforementioned data and the compilation of 210 pages of BDCA match scores has caught my interest and curiosity. What has been highlighted here have been numerous incredible performances and individuals within the competition. My scope has been broadened to looking at community leaders such as members of parliament and councillors, farmers and business professionals, leading sports participants and administrators who have contributed to the league.

I intend to produce a history of the BDCA which will feature people and clubs which have influenced cricket in the community now and still having an impact in the future.

(5) Neighbouring Club Histories

Work has commenced on researching histories by Burwood CC (Stella Barber) and Ashburton CC (Sarah Craze), which were opponents in the former Burwood & District Cricket Association. I am supporting them, as the sharing of information benefits all clubs.

STATISTICAL

(1) National Cricket database - MyCricket

The last few available pieces of historical scores for BHRDCA men's games have been entered into MyCricket. Colin Howard completed the majority of entries and his tally reached an incredible 160 scorebooks – a significant contribution.

The intention of extending this initiative into the ladies and junior sections, is on hold until the respective Associations can get themselves organised set-up the fixtures into the database.

A concern has been raised about the reliability of MyCricket in the future as Cricket Australia have appointed a new system manager of the on-line system.

(2) Team Scorebooks

Is the last 12 months we have not found any more of the missing scorebooks, and I have crossed my fingers in the hope that someone, somewhere, we may find one or more of the 44 (12 Men's, 1 girls' and 31 juniors) missing books.

Assistance Required – chase up Captains and Team Managers to obtain the missing scorebooks. (A full list is available.)

(3) Individual Career Records

A master file of close to 3,000 former players has been created. At the moment career spreadsheets have been set-up to record grade-by-grade and season-by-season records for around 500 players. The aim is to extend this to every individual player in our history. It is still a work-in-progress as data from the 1998/99 season through to 3 seasons ago have only been prepared for long serving players and current one.

(4) BHRDCA Heritage Committee

This Heritage Committee, driven by Andy Lambert (East Doncaster CC) has regularly produced reports on performance in the BHRDCA including Clubs, Premierships, Batting and Bowling achievements. These are available to view or download on the BHRDCA website.

I have sighted a draft work-in-progress version of BHRDCA Stats history from 2008/09 to 2022/23 season. For the first time it incorporates Toogood and Watson Medallists, McIntosh Memorial Awards and the Veteran's Section. Ones to feature from our club are Charlie Dart, Jeff Costello, Steve Wood, Adrian Reus, Bede Allsopp and myself.

A database of the contact details of past members is being progressively being built up. Currently there are 172 people listed. In the past twelve months several more players have been added, these include Daryl Haeusler Wayne Jordan, Andrew MacPhie, Brian Millane, Olivia Kinnear and Alyssa Underwood, each has made a contribution to our club's success, so it is good to keep them in the loop. There are many more and it would be great to have them on our lists to be informed and involved.
